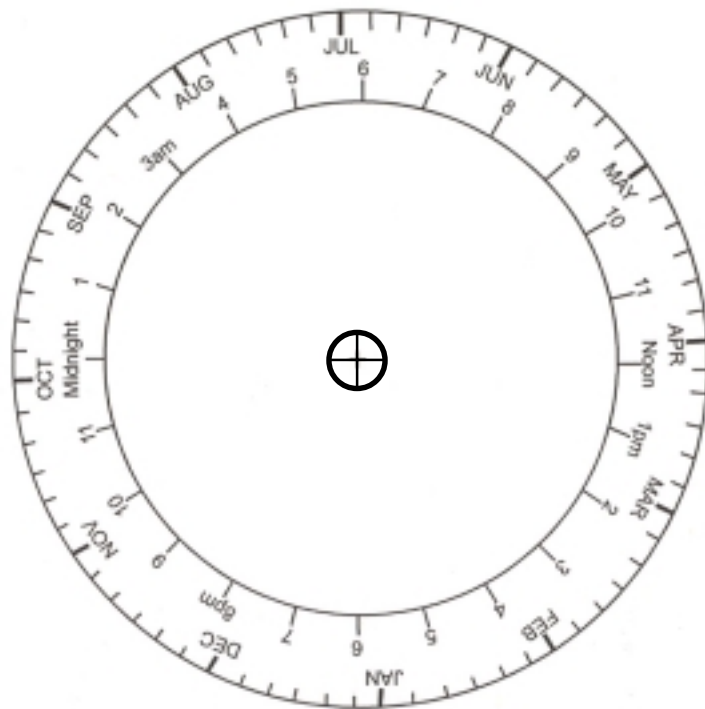
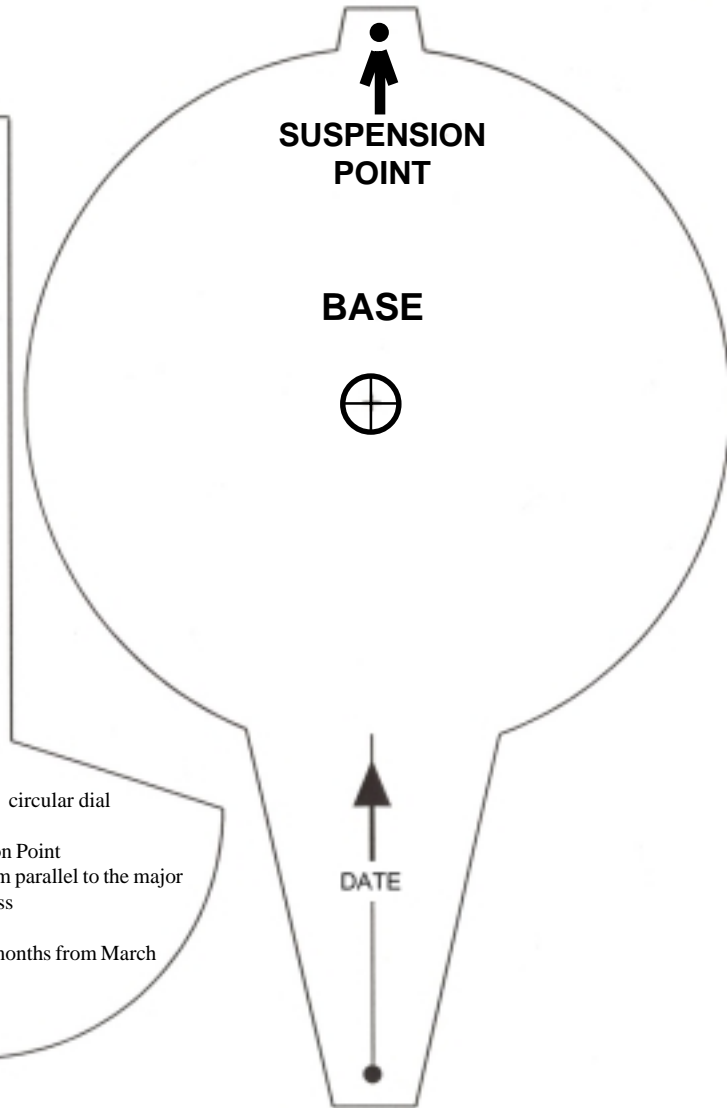


OFFICIAL BLUE PARROT CONCH TIME CLOCK



BLUE PARROT TIME - POINTING ARM



ASSEMBLY:

1. Print on heavy card stock or glue to cardboard
2. Cut out with hobby knife (or something very sharp and accurate)
3. Make pin holes at the ⊕ center marks
4. Assemble with the base on the bottom, then the circular dial, then the pointing arm on top, held together with a pin through the center marks

1. Set date on ⊕ circular dial
2. Hang from Suspension Point
3. Align the pointing arm parallel to the major axis of the Southern Cross
4. Read time off dial
5. Adjust for DST and months from March

How to tell time: Let the Southern Cross to be the hour hand of a 24 hour clock (24 at the top, 12 at the bottom, 6 and 18 between the two).

The South Celestial Pole is the center of the clock. The imaginary clock rotates with the long axis acting as the pointer around Acrux, and the other three acting as an arrowhead pointer to the imaginary twenty-four hour clock face.

The sighting is exact on March 29th, each year. To correct for dates other than March 29 deduct 2 hours from the sighted time for each month since March 29.
